

2019 University of Scouting Class Offerings

Basic Leader Training Classes

If you are not trained for your current position, we strongly encourage you to enroll in these first.

Charter Organization Representative Training, 1 hour

This course is intended to provide COR's with information and tools they need to build a successful and meaningful relationship with the unit(s) chartered by their organization.

Cub Scout Committee Chair and Member Challenge, 3 hours

This course is intended to provide pack Committee Chairs and Committee Members information on how to serve in these positions. Committee Chairs and Committee Members, that take this course along with Youth Protection will be considered Trained in their positions.

Cubmaster/ Assistant Cubmaster Specific Training, 3 hours

This course is intended to provide Cubmasters and Assistant Cubmasters the tools they need to serve in these positions. Cubmasters and Assistant Cubmasters that take this course along with Youth Protection will be considered Trained in their positions.

Boy Scout/ Venture Crew/ Sea Scout Committee Chair and Member Challenge, 3 hours

The course is intended to provide Committee Chairs and Members information on how to service in these positions. Committee Chairs and members that take this course along with current Youth Protection training will be considered Trained in their positions.

Den Leader Specific Training, 3 hours

This course is intended to provide Tiger Cub, Wolf and Bear Den Leaders with the information and tools they need to conduct successful den meetings. Den Leaders and Assistants who complete this training and Youth Protection Training are considered Trained for all three positions.

Scoutmaster Specific, 3 hours

This course will provide Scoutmasters and Assistant Scoutmaster with the information and tools they need to lead successful Boy Scout Troops. Scoutmasters and Assistants that complete this course, Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills, and Youth Protection are considered Trained for their position.

Webelos Leader Specific Training, 3 hours

This course is intended to provide Webelos Den Leaders with the information and tools they need to conduct successful Webelos Den Meetings. Webelos Leaders and Assistants who complete this training and Youth Protection training are considered Trained for both positions.

Youth Protection Training, 1 hour

Youth Protection training is designed to help you keep our youth safe from abuse. You will learn the Boy Scouts of America's Youth Protection Guidelines, signs of abuse, and how to report

suspected abuse. After each section of material, you will answer questions about that section's topic. Participants that complete this course will be considered Trained in Youth Protection.

Venture Crew Advisor Specific Training, 3 hours

This course will provide an introduction to the responsibilities, opportunities, and resources that will ensure a successful Venturing crew leadership experience. Advisors and Assistants that complete this course and Youth Protection will be considered Trained in their position.

Boy Scout, Venture Scout, and Sea Ships College

Merit Badge Counselor Training, 1 hour

This course focuses on what is expected of a Merit Badge Counselor.

Life to Eagle, 1 hour Coweta District Advancement Chairman & Eagle Scout Coach; Jim McCarthy will be presenting an informative and in depth review on what is required to earn the highest rank in scouting, the Rank of Eagle. This Class will take a step by step approach in helping everyone understand the requirements and the process of earning the rank of Eagle Scout.

What will be covered...the Eagle Scout 2019 requirements, the Eagle Scout Leadership Project Proposal, the order of the needed approvals, the paperwork, and the Eagle Scout application and its approvals. A must for all who sit on Eagle Boards of Review, Scoutmasters, Scout Leaders who help with rank advancement, and Unit Advancement Chairs.

Cub Scout College

BALOO, Friday 5pm thru Saturday 7pm- you will camp overnight

This course is designed as an introduction to the Cub Scout outdoor program for those leaders who are interested in adding a camping component to their Pack activities. BSA's Cub Scout level camping policies will be taught along with the necessary tools to help units carry out a successful camping experience. Completion of this course is mandatory for at least one adult on a Pack overnigher.

Cub Scout Shooting Sports Rangemaster, 5 hours

Become a shooting sports instructor for Cub Scouts BB Guns, Bow and Arrows and Wrist Rockets. With this training you can volunteer at District and Council events or serve as your own pack's instructor at the Lawhorn Scouting Base.

General Classes For All Leaders

Dutch Oven Cooking, 1 hour (additional \$6- this class will include your lunch)

Order of the Arrow 101, 1 hour

What is the Order of the Arrow program? What opportunities are there? How to make the best use in your troop? Come and learn about this BSA service organization.

Religious Emblems, 1 hour

Learn about the programs offered for all Scouts and Adults to earn their religious emblems awards.

Safe Swim Defense and Safety Afloat, 1 hour

Safe Swim Defense and Safety Afloat have been developed to promote swimming and boating safety and to set standards for safe unit activity afloat. Before a BSA group may engage in an excursion, expedition, or trip on the water (canoe, raft, sailboat, motorboat, rowboat, tube, or other craft), adult leaders for such activity must complete Safety Afloat Training, have a commitment card with them, and be dedicated to full compliance with all nine points of Safety Afloat.

Hazardous Weather, 1 hour

Weather conditions—good, bad, and ugly—are an important factor in any outdoor Scouting activity. In fact, how you plan and prepare for the weather can make the difference between a great outdoor experience, a miserable or cancelled outing, and even injury or death in hazardous conditions. The Weather Smart training you have just completed is designed to help you and your troop plan and prepare for hazardous weather—to make you, “Weather Smart.”

Commissioner Classes

Unit Commissioner Basics, 3 hours

This training will examine: what a commissioner is, what a commissioner does, and how a commissioner does it. At the end of this training you should: understand the 4 objectives of unit service, understand the four-function concept of council and district operations, understand the commissioner’s role in supporting units, understand the primary tools available to unit commissioners.
